St. Thomas More, 1478-1535 was a devout catholic lay man who served Church and society with devotion and skill. More was a humanist who believed in the power of reason and learning. He argued for moral and social reform through education. He was executed for his opposition to certain divisive decisions made by Henry VIII. St. Thomas More was a model of a Catholic lay person of courage, skill and commitment, who helped shape society and church for the better.

His feast day is June 22.
