- Fr. John J. MacDonald (Port Hawkesbury) remains in the Richmond Hospital and continues to experience declining health.
- Fr. Evo's mother, Gina, had another slight heart attack in mid November. She spent some time in hospital and is back home recovering.
- Fr. Doug MacIntyre died on November 1, 2015 and his funeral took place at St. Leonard Church, New Waterford, on Thursday, November 5. May he rest in peace.
- Fr. Reginald Currie died on November 10, 2015 and his funeral took place at St. Joseph's Church, Reserve Mines, on Friday, November 13. May he rest in peace.
- Fr. Frank Morley died on November 16, 2015 and his funeral will take place at St. Anne Church, Glace Bay on Friday, November 20 May he rest in peace.
- In light of Fr. Michael Rankin's declining health, Fr. Dan MacInnis has agreed to provide for the celebration of Masses at MacGillivray Nursing Home, Sydney.
- Fr. Angus MacDougall will complete his ministry at Eskasoni and will begin ministry at Our Lady of Lourdes on Friday, December 5, 2015.

Pastoral Centre Relocation

Please be advised that the Committee to consider the relocation of the Pastoral Centre has completed its review of the various options as they considered the relocation of the Pastoral Centre back to Sydney. In accord with the recommendations from this review, a suite in Membertou (in one of the strip malls) will become the Diocesan Pastoral Center. We have entered into a five year lease with an option to renew for another five years. A floor plan has been completed to suit our current needs and allow for some growth in the future. We hope that we will occupy the new office early in the new year.

Pastoral Visit to Parishes

During the past few years I have mentioned that I would like to make a Pastoral Visit to all parishes of the diocese. I have been able to visit many parishes, but still have not had a Pastoral Visit with

many others. I am still open to do that visit over the next few months. In the mean time, I hope to have meetings with Pastoral Councils and Finance Councils/Committees beginning in January. I will come to the parish on a weekday evening and meet with this involved in these councils. Further information will be forthcoming.

Workshops for Parish Finance Councils/Committees and for Communication Ministry

The Diocese is sponsoring workshops for Priests and Parish Finance Committees on issues of finance and communication. Two workshops are planned: Friday, November 27, 2015 from 10 to 12 pm at St. Ninian Place in Antigonish and Thursday, December 3 from 1 to 3 pm at Our Lady of Fatima Parish Hall in Sydney. All priests are asked to attend one of these workshops with one or two members of their Pastoral/Finance Committee as well as any staff members involved in finances. This will be an opportunity to review the levy policies and financial reporting. People may attend either workshop. As well, Jennifer Hatt, Communications Officer for the Diocese, will be in attendance to update everyone on her communications plan and to provide an update on the development of the website.

Support for Family Services

Please be aware of the work of Family Services. This Agency has more than twenty service projects offering counseling and programs to both families and individuals serving all of Cape Breton, Antigonish, Guysborough and Pictou counties. Services include a referral network for both parish priests and pastoral workers for parenting, marriage, pre-marriage, adoption options, youth outreach services, facilitated parish sessions, availability of social workers to process discussions around freedom to marry after a declaration of nullity as well as grief and loss issues.

Support from Parish, religious and Diocese has aided and continues to aid the Agency in providing these services. Donations received directly subsidize the working poor which includes the majority of our clientele (3,500 clients were served this past year). Please be generous in donating to the annual collection for this Agency.

Special Collection on Behalf of Syrian Refugees

It seems that about five or six parishes are in the process of sponsoring a refugee family. In order to assist these parishes, I am asking that parishes take up a **Special Collection on December 13**, which will be used to assist the families who will be sponsored in our diocese. Please encourage your parishioners to be generous. Please send your collection to the Business Office which will distribute it to the various parishes.

Ongoing Formation for Priests: November 24-26

Ongoing Formation of Priests will take place with Fr. Paul Turner on November 24-26, 2015. Fr. Paul will consider the theology of the Eucharist and then present on the theme of presiding at the Eucharist and at other liturgical events. Please **register today** if you plan to attend.

Year of Mercy


